P5 Outdoor Adventure Camp 2022 Frequently Asked Questions

1. Why do we have outdoor adventure camp for Primary 5 students?

This camp will incorporate adventure learning and character development. It seeks to explore and impart values of teamwork, respect, resilience, responsibility and confidence building through various challenges that will require students to explore beyond their comfort zones and find solutions for complex situations.

After every activity, group facilitation would be carried out to ensure that learning points are delivered and internalised.

- 2. What are some of the outdoor activities the students will be doing?
 - (a) Simple map reading, tying of knots and lashing
 - (b) Outdoor cooking
 - (c) Hiking
 - (d) Team-building activities
 - (e) Low Elements activities
- 3. What are the precautions the school will be taking to ensure the well-being and safety of the students?
 - (a) A sick bay is on site for students who are unwell to rest and wait for their parents to fetch them home if they need to be taken out for further treatment and rest. There is also a quarantine room for anyone showing Covid19 related symptoms.
 - (b) All camp instructors and teachers are trained in Standard First Aid with CPR and AED certification.
 - (c) For medical emergencies, there is a safety vehicle with a First Aider on standby. The nearest 24 hour clinic is at Alexandra Hospital and for emergencies, they will be sent to National University Hospital.
 - (d) Before each activity, instructors will check with the students if anyone is not feeling well. This is to ensure that students who are unwell do not carry out the activity.
 - (e) If any students do not feel comfortable with a particular activity, they can opt out of the activity. However, students are strongly encouraged to participate in all activities so that they can obtain the maximum learning benefits from the camp programme.
- 4. What is the reporting and dismissal time for the 3 camp days?

Students can wear plain black or dark blue shorts and plain white t-shirts if they do not have sufficient PE t-shirts or shorts to last 3 days. There should be no elaborate designs on the t-shirt/shorts. No other colours of t-shirts or shorts will be allowed.
